Stuff the Truck – We Did it!!!

"Why does God allow disasters to happen?" That's a question most often asked by people who have lost everything due to a fire, hurricane, tornado or any kind of disaster. As we know, God isn't responsible for the devastation, we live in a world of sin. God is responsible and active in the rebuilding following a disaster! One of the ways He works is through the NALC Disaster Response Team, and He has used the hearts and hands of BFLC members these past couple months. With the assistance of five other congregations, a 12-foot truck was filled with supplies for future disasters. This truck is going to a warehouse in Tyler, Texas in preparation for a possible hurricane building up on the coast. They are already experiencing flooding. The supplies many of you prepared for this truck are items that become very scarce following a disaster once clean-up begins. That's when the NALC Disaster team sends in their trucks and hands out flood buckets or health kits. There is never a charge.

As BFLC volunteers listened to a presentation before we started stuffing the truck, we all were amazed at what our church at large is accomplishing with over 450 congregations donating time and talent and funds. Once Fema and insurance is maxed out for families, the NALC Disaster Team finishes the job, no matter what tasks remain. A box truck, a 28' trailer, 2 pick-up trucks, 3 tool trailers and 2 shower trailers are available to NALC congregations when disasters strike. Within three days after the condo collapsed in Surfside, FL, the Disaster team was there. Not only do they offer the above-mentioned services, they also provide spiritual Christian care.

The following is what members of BFLC "stuffed" into the truck: 46 flood buckets; 61 quilts/new afghans; 86 health kits; 85 backpacks; 45 Bibles; 8 boxes of diapers; 11 shovels; 12 rakes; 18 brooms and \$125 in gift cards!

We have been blessed to be a blessing to others.

Didi in the Congo

We were thankful to have Didi, Serafina and two of their daughters (Nicole and Sarah) with us. Nicole, married, lives in Syracuse, New York, and the family is staying with them until they leave for the Congo on July 1.

At long last, the vehicle and the donations from Black Forest and many other churches arrived in Boma. The container changed ships and there was a 3-week delay for customs. The donations and vehicle are stored at the Panzo's house until they return. The seminary is going well but is struggling with funding. The instructors have not been properly paid and they have family expenses. The seminary is important to ensure Lutheran church leaders are properly trained to lead their congregations.

Please pray for their safe return to Boma. It involves about 3 flights and a long journey by land. Didi would also like to receive emails to know he is supported, and we are praying for him.

50th Anniversary Year for Black Forest Lutheran Church

1971 - 2021

A Little Bit of History

January 1981 brought us into our 10th year! The theme for the celebration was "Declare His Glory". The ladies from Our Lady of the Pines Catholic Church prepared the meal for the evening celebration. Duane Steinke was our Master of Ceremonies. Our little church in the forest continued to grow in membership and programs in the eighties. Howard Fischer became our first head shepherd to run the shepherding program. This was an extension of pastoral ministry helping meet the needs of our members. This program continues to this day.

In August 1982 Pastor Jacobson accepted a call to Trinity Lutheran in Spencer, Iowa. Pastor Jim Austin served as Vice Pastor through December. In October, a call was extended to an Associate Pastor at Holy Trinity Lutheran in Littleton, CO, Mark Peterson. He envisioned two churches - Black Forest Lutheran and the mission congregation in Monument - emerging, both strong in numbers and, most certainly strong in spirit and faith. Pastor Peterson was installed on January 2, 1983, at both congregations. His employment began in early December 1982, and that Christmas Eve turned out to be very memorable for everyone – services were cancelled due to snow.

BFLC with worship centers in Black Forest and Tri-Lakes was a testament to the fact that our Mission Statement was not just words. Pastor Peterson said he was amazed at the amount of commitment from the members. He said they take seriously the call to be a Priesthood of Believers. "As I look at our programs in worship, education and our outreach in service and witness, I think we are fulfilling our mission as God's Church."

In 1984 Long Range Planning did an analysis of the demographics of both the Black Forest and Tri-Lakes areas. Both worship areas were outgrowing their space. In 1985 the congregation voted to start the design process for both worship centers and authorized operational funding. Two design subcommittees were formed with Duane Steinke in charge of Black Forest and John Butler at Monument. Movement to construct a first unit at Tri-Lakes was spurred on by a donation of land by Alfred and Frances Wahlborg. On November 10, 1985, there was a short service of dedication on the property.

Another significant event occurred in 1985 when we began to organize with three other churches a Care and Share program which came into fruition the following year. Black Forest Lutheran would eventually house the pantry. Kathy Steinke and Lydia Zelones were head coordinators, and they continued in that position for many, many years. In this the year of our 50th, Lydia continues to manage Black Forest Cares.

During this time our outdoor worship area was built. Little did those folks know what a gift that would be in the year 2020 with the arrival of COVID! As a result of their foresight, we were able to worship in person much sooner than most congregations.

In September 1986, the congregation voted to proceed with the Tri-Lakes building. The design process was underway, now time to face up to the other part of the project – raising money. At Tri-Lakes a fund-raising goal of \$25,000 began. At Black Forest, while the fund raising wasn't scheduled to begin yet, an anonymous member came forth with a \$20,000 gift and challenged the members to match it by years end, and that challenge was met along with 75% of Tri-Lakes goal. Music is an integral part of worship, and we had the talent. By 1986 we had four choirs: Sandy Nutter directed the adult choir, Beverly Decker directed the youth choir at Black Forest, and Jenny Kissinger directed the adult choir and Vicky Schroeder led the youth choir at Tri-Lakes.

In January 1988, a new Lutheran Church was formed with the merging of the Lutheran Church of America, the American Lutheran Church and the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches. Black Forest Lutheran was now part of a 5.3 million-member Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

LFS Backpacks

The Social Ministry Committee supports a wide variety of causes both locally, nationally and internationally. Sometimes additional opportunities are presented if individuals wish to supplement the monies already being used for a particular project. The committee does not expect additional support but want to make members aware of needs in our community and world. With that being said, here is one more opportunity if you are so inclined to support it.

Lutheran Family Services provides backpacks for foster and refugee children as they begin the school year. The backpack is filled with school supplies and is supplemented with a \$20 gift card to Target or Walmart to purchase items not included in the backpack. The school supplies will be provided this year by a group called *COS/LoveYou*. Some students need specific items requested by a teacher that are not included in the backpack. Students may also use the card to pick out shoes or new clothes for that first day of school (Some have never had a new outfit!)

The committee will use the monies allocated to this project to purchase gift cards. If you feel called to donate a gift card or money toward one, please drop the card or money in the offering box (checks made out to BFLC) with a notation for LFS Backpacks or bring the card/money to the church office by July 12.
