MOSAIC Social Ministry Focus of the Month

Mosaic is a non-profit organization that supports people with intellectual and behavioral health needs, autism, and aging adults, and provides opportunities for them to enjoy a full life. Mosaic's mission embraces God's call to serve in the world. Services are provided in the primary areas of:

- Mosaic at Home
- Residential Services
- Day Program
- Employment Services,
- Daily Respite, and
- Children's Extensive Services.

Mosaic was founded in 1913 in Axtell, Nebraska when it was known as Bethphage Inner Mission Association. In 1925, in Sterling, Nebraska, Martin Luther Home was founded as a school for children with developmental disabilities. In 2003, Bethphage and Martin Luther Home combined and became Mosaic, the largest faith-based provider of services to people with disabilities in the U.S.

Today, Mosaic's more than 3,300 employees provide a life of possibilities to nearly 3,700 people with intellectual disabilities in 36 agencies across 10 states and in 3 foreign countries, providing supports to around 3,700 people! There are four agencies in Colorado, and we are blessed to have had one in Colorado Springs for 38 years.

Mosaic is primarily Medicaid funded; however, there is a gap in funding that needs to come from donors. Each October, our local Mosaic reaches out to the community with their annual fundraiser, so watch for information in this regard as an opportunity to support their efforts.



Didi in the Congo

Didi is back at work in the Congo. He is at the seminary in Tshela. His shipment arrived safely, even while he was in the US. He says the new truck is working well, as well as his new appliances. I believe he has a new stove and refrigerator. They had to be specially ordered to match the electricity in the Congo.

The seminary has been struggling to feed everyone, students and their families. They grow much of their food but have no equipment. He is looking for a cultivator available for purchase in the Congo.

In with his vehicle were clothes for the orphans in Boma and books for the seminary. They are being well received. Even though English is not the prime language, the books can help the students improve their English skills.

Please pray for the safety of Didi and Serafina as few people in the DRC have been vaccinated.

50th Anníversary Year for Black Forest Lutheran Church January 10, 1971 A Líttle Bít of Hístory

In August 1989, Jim Foster, our second Intern, arrived. His most unusual experience was probably when he learned to run a jack hammer! All our lives were touched by Jim and his family. In his words, "this unique faith community shaped our lives and my ministry."

While the starting of a new mission at Tri-Lakes and the back-to-back construction programs of two new worship centers demanded a considerable amount of time, energy and resources during the 80's, commitment and dedication to other mission efforts continued. Benevolence contributions in support of the work of the Church at Large, hunger projects, Black Forest Care & Share, and concern for the sick and aged were sustained at a level that reflects the fiber and commitment of the membership to the Lord's work.

In November of 1989, Pastor Peterson accepted a call to Mt. Calvary in Boulder, CO. Under his spiritual leadership, the building at Tri-Lakes had been completed, the sanctuary at Black Forest was nearing completion, and the members of the combined worship centers exceeded 500 baptized members. Pastor Gunderman from Arvada, CO became our Interim Pastor. He led our Service of Entry into the new sanctuary on Christmas Eve 1989.

In January 1990, following a congregational study report, it was resolved that it is the intention of BFLC to affect the separation of the Black Forest Worship Center and the Trinity Worship Center into two independent incorporated congregations at such time as each has demonstrated the ability to independently support themselves, develop an experienced lay leadership capability, and a desire to separate is perceived to be in the best interest of the continuing mission of the church.

Two call committees were formed, and two congregational profiles were developed. During this time, the landscaping project continued, which included an outdoor worship area. The dedication of the new sanctuary was held on March 4, 1990. The separation of the two worship centers occurred on August 1, 1990. Pastor Kenneth Dean Hohag, Associate Pastor of Holy Shepherd Lutheran Church in Lakewood, CO, was called to serve BFLC. Retired Pastor Robert Berthelson began serving Trinity as Interim on August 5.

Pastor Ken's installation was August 12, 1990. The many gifts that Pastor Ken brought with him included his wife, Melanie and their three children, Miriam, Gabriel and Rebecca. In his first newsletter article he wrote the following:

"As we begin to live out our faith together, I anticipate several things happening: 1) We will be a people of prayer; 2) Christ will be the center of all we do; 3) We will grow into a profound sense of His love and presence."

Sing to the Lord a New Song! Sad news. The Joyful Noise Singing Group had been leading the contemporary worship music the past year, and most of them were Trinity members! Happy news! Our new Pastor and his wife developed a new contemporary worship group over time. Melanie directed a junior choir and Sandy Nutter was the director for the senior choir.

Several of our youth attended the National Youth Gathering in TX, along with 27,000 high school youth. To help finance this trip the youth hosted the first Sweetheart Dinner! (This event has continued every year since, except this year, due to COVID restrictions.) Youth events and confirmation camps were also held at the beautiful Wittwer Ranch in Guffey, CO.

As the congregation grew, so did our ministry programs, which we will go into next month.

50th Anniversary Banner Save the Date!!

As you know, this is Black Forest Lutheran Church's 50th Anniversary year. Our big celebration is going to be **Sunday, April 24, 2022**, so SAVE THE DATE! Due to COVID it was necessary to postpone our in-person celebration. We hope you are reading our history/memory articles in the Scribe. The latest addition to commemorate our 50th is the banner that has been hung in the narthex. We thank Donna Reiner for her design and beautiful work in creating it. As you enter church the remainder of this year, notice the banner and give a silent prayer of thanks to our awesome God for this place of worship in the forest. Not only is this where trees grow, but also a place for our faith to grow.



Convocation hears vision updates, affirms decisions

The 2021 NALC Mission Convocation heard updates on the 10 points of the NALC's 2020 Vision and overwhelmingly approved two resolutions supporting decisions by the Executive Council to establish a central NALC office in the Dallas-Fort Worth, Texas, area and to add four part-time assistants to the bishop.

The convocation revolved around the 10 points of the 2020 Vision. Each vision point was highlighted with oral and written reports. Opportunities for discussion of each point and questions from delegates were provided.

More than 400 delegates and visitors gathered August 4-6 in Corpus Christi, Texas, for the 2021 Mission Convocation around the theme, "God the Father Creates." The convocation and the events preceding it comprise the NALC's annual Lutheran Week.

2020 Vision Appeal: We are excited to share that we are moving forward with funding and implementing our 2020 Vision with the full support of the bishop and Executive Council. We are working with Cramer & Associates from Dublin, Ohio, a Christian-based philanthropic advisory firm, to execute this powerful and important initiative. We look forward to communicating and working with you on building our future.

Elections: The Rev. Mark Werner of Pittsgrove, New Jersey, and Joel Williams of Erwin, South Dakota, were elected to four-year terms on the Executive Council. The Rev. Dr. Jeffray Greene of Brooks, Georgia, and Matthew Lind of Bainbridge Island, Washington, were elected to the Court of Adjudication. The Rev. Dr. Amy Little was installed as the General Secretary of the NALC. The general secretary is the chief operating officer of the NALC and manages its administrative functions.

A major address on the convocation theme, "God the Father Creates," was delivered by the Rev. Dr. Steven Paulson. He focused on the significance of the first article of the Apostles' Creed and Martin Luther's explanation of it in his Small Catechism.

Melissa Ohden told the moving story of her life as the survivor of a failed saline infusion abortion and now as an advocate for abortion survivors and pro-life policies.

2022 budgets were approved. The Convocation approved a \$2 million Operating Budget for the NALC. Budgets were also approved for the church's designated funds: \$875,000 for the Theological Education Fund (which includes the North American Lutheran Seminary); \$215,500 for the Great Commission Fund; and \$143,000 for the Disaster Response Fund.

Prayer for Ethiopia: The convocation unanimously approved a resolution inviting NALC pastors, congregations and members to unite in "intentional and intensive prayer for Ethiopia." Ethiopia is going through a time of significant political unrest. The NALC is in a full-communion relationship with the Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, the largest Lutheran church in the world.

Amendments to the NALC Constitution adding language naming mission districts and mission regions were approved. The amendments must be ratified by NALC congregations.

Reports of the work of the NALC's staff, teams, task forces, ministries and ministry partners were warmly received.

The Braaten-Benne Lectures in Theology, which preceded the convocation, focused on God the Father. Other events of Lutheran week included the Women of the NALC Annual Gathering and workshops on discipleship, stewardship and youth ministry.
