It was in reflection of this verse that I heard the following, which hopefully I will get mostly right...

Jeni found herself with a lot of free time one day, and so she decided to try and see Christ in everyone she met. Whether it was shopping at the store, or when she visited an art gallery, she just tried to see Christ in everyone she met. The results astonished her: she had "the best day ever". She kept meeting people and having great conversations. People would open up to her and tell her all about their lives. Almost everyone she met was pleasant. Jeni had a very remarkable day with all these experiences.

Then the question arose: *"Why don't we all do this every day?"* That wasn't as fun of a discussion, though it was needed. My proposal is this: Try it today. Treat everyone you come across as though they were Jesus Christ Himself. I don't mean to bow down and worship everyone. What I mean is to treat everyone with the same love, respect, dignity and consideration as you would our Lord Jesus. If it makes it easier to imagine, treat all women like Mary the mother of Jesus.

Before you get distracted with your daily routines or work, give it a try today. This is me wishing you "the best day ever". God bless you.

Sometimes children need to be taken away from their parents for their own safety. That's when foster parents step in – sometimes in the middle of the night – to welcome and comfort the kids to a temporary home. But foster parents have a very difficult task and can be overwhelmed with the demanding work. Having extra help from some special friends makes a big difference in the future success of the foster kids.

This is where the **Fostering Hope Foundation** steps in providing volunteers from a church to walk alongside the foster parents. A group from our congregation just completed such an assignment with the help of a Fostering Hope Coordinator. The Buttermore, Kosman, Lord, Montie, and Reily families worked with a family of five who foster parented an additional set of two-year-old triplets, with a very successful experience for the children!

Volunteers commit to help for a year, offering support such as preparing a meal on a busy day, helping with indoor/outdoor chores, babysitting or tutoring or just listening to the foster parents and praying. They meet monthly hearing the latest needs of the foster parents to coordinate what types of help are needed and can be provided.

Have you heard of Team Rubicon or Tunnel to Towers?

The Social Ministry committee would like to introduce two new charities that we are now supporting.

Team Rubicon's mission is to "serve communities by mobilizing veterans to continue their service, leveraging their skills and experience to help people prepare, respond, and recover from disasters and humanitarian crises." Team Rubicon volunteers were recently in Colorado Springs helping the elderly, uninsured and disabled with clean up after the severe windstorm on December 15th. The volunteer's new tagline slogan is "built to serve".

Tunnel to Towers mission is to *"honor the sacrifice of firefighter Stephen Siller who laid down his life to save others on* September 11, 2001. We also honor our military, and first responders who continue to make the supreme sacrifice of life and limb for our country." The organization has delivered several mortgage-free homes to families of fallen heroes. Tunnel to Towers is also committed to helping end homelessness amongst the Veteran community.

Seeking Nominations for Additional Beneficiaries of the Mission Endowment Fund

Do you have ideas on who our Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) could benefit? Is there an organization or an individual, either local, national, or international that the MEF Committee should consider supporting?

The MEF receives funds, not from the church's budget, but from special designated offerings to focus on supporting unique needs outside of the normal congregation's benevolence giving. That means we seek to support causes not being supported (or fully supported) by the Christian Education, Evangelism, or Social Ministry Committees.

Currently, the MEF Committee is providing educational support to Pastor Albert, a Lutheran pastor at the Betela Seminary in Madagascar. Though we are limited to disbursing 10% of our assets each year, we occasionally have funds available to support another cause. The MEF Committee meets quarterly to evaluate proposals/requests for funding support. They may be a one-time need or a recurring need.

- The eye camp held last September has helped many people in the Congo recover their sight. One woman waited 7 years but now she can see and read her Bible again.
- There have been a lot of deaths due to Covid-19 in the Congo. People refuse to wear masks and won't get vaccinated because they fear it is a way for the government to kill them. Some families have lost 2-3 members in the same week, and then you have to decide which funeral to go to. Please pray for them and their families.
- Didi was the preacher of the day for the installation of Reverend Masiala Makubu Riffin. Didi spoke on "Pastors as models to the flock".
- Didi and Serafina counseled and helped a young 16-year-old single mom of a disabled baby find a family that will help her until she can get on her feet.

Didi and Serafina are very grateful for the support and prayers of everyone at Black Forest Lutheran Church.

50th Anníversary Year for Black Forest Lutheran Church January 10, 1971 A Líttle Bít of Hístory

Our first 50 years of remembering draws to a close with this last article of reminiscing in the life of the church in the forest. Two thousand twenty was a most unusual year! Church life started as normal, and many of us enjoyed the annual Sweetheart dinner in February. The theme was *"Under the Sea";* little did we know that soon the world-view theme would be "Under House Arrest". A pandemic (COVID) had hit the world hard, many places, including churches were considered non-essential and shut down. A non-essential classification doesn't stop God! BFLC got creative. Thanks to the talents of several of our members, especially Patrick Turechek, our services were televised within a couple weeks of the shutdown. Our services were already being recorded for audio, so we never missed a service. Pastor Ken and a few assistants conducted services every week during the 11-week shutdown, which included Lenten services, Palm Sunday and Easter.

There was a lot of restructuring on how to do ministry, but members stepped forward. We kept in touch with each other via the phone, sewed face masks, and younger people ran errands for the elderly, as the elderly population was hit the worst. During this time, Rich Byrnes died, but that didn't stop people from joining Carolyn. Several cars parked in the parking lot and listened to the service on the radio.

During the shutdown we hired a new Youth and Family Ministries Director, Jacob Oglesby. He was interviewed and introduced to us via zoom. Yes, the "zoom" word became very common during this time.

BFLC was fortunate in the fact that we had an outdoor worship area and were able to worship once again in person – socially distanced, of course – on Sunday, June 7, 2020. Most churches would still not be worshipping in-person for several months! In late September we began worship inside, online or in the parking lot. For those worshipping inside, there was tape marking where family units could sit (but don't sit on the tape!).

Life began to return to normal in 2021, programs resumed, we could gather in Fellowship Hall, enjoy fellowship & donuts, and people were once again able to shake hands and hug if they so desired! Pastor reminded us of Paul's comforting words in Matthew when our Lord promised that he will be with us always. No matter what we are going through and experiencing, no matter what events and unrest may be occurring in the world, or in our own households, let us continually look to the cross for our answers.

Hiring an associate pastor had been on our radar for several years, and in spite of the shutdown, the Calling Committee found a match for BFLC - John Graham. He joined us with his wife, Amanda, and children, Adeline and William. His installation was July 11, 2021. Also, during this time Lisa Regennitter stepped into the Director of Ministries/Office Manager position and, Michelle Madison was hired as our new Administrative Assistant.

Let's end our 50-year history with some humor - "Pandemic Ten Commandments"

- Thou shall worship the Lord your God in-person; in the parking lot; or on-line
- Thou shall wear a cloth over thy nose & mouth
- Thou shall use sanitizer on thy hands when entering the church
- Thou shall honor the tape in the pews and not sit on the tape
- Thou shall honor social distancing
- Thou shall only touch thine own bulletin
- ✤ Thou shall not shake hands
- Thou shall not congregate
- Thou shall wear sterile gloves when handling communion elements
- Thou shall not eat food, including Sunday donuts, on the premises
