

Marian House, operated by Catholic Charities, provides a daily noon meal to those in need. Right now, approximately 250-275 meals are served daily. In May, BFLC sponsored the meal along with Holy Trinity Catholic Church for one day. <u>On the</u> <u>last Thursday and any 5th Saturday of a month</u>, you will find several people from BFLC along with volunteers from Holy Trinity Catholic Church volunteering their time to prepare food for this nutritious meal and /or serving the meal to those in need. This occurs at Marian House located at 14 West Bijou in downtown Colorado Springs. Each congregation is asked to provide 10 volunteers per month. We have lost several volunteers in the past year due to illness and moving out of the area. Currently, we have 5-6 regular volunteers, <u>but we need a few more to make the job easier for all</u>. Food preparation begins at 7:00a, and serving the meal runs from 10:30a to 1:00p. The Rocky Mountain Fisher House

Many veterans and active-duty military undergo extended medical treatment for several weeks or months, RMFH provides a place to stay at no cost to these families. The Rocky Mountain Fisher House (RMFH) has nine suites, with private bedrooms and baths. Families share a common kitchen, laundry facility, a warm dining room, and an inviting living room. The Rocky Mountain Fisher House ensures that there is never a lodging fee.

The house is operated by the Denver VA Medical Center and supported by the RMFH Foundation. The VA is responsible for maintenance, operations, upkeep, and staff.

Guests can stay at the RMFH provided a veteran or active-duty service member is a patient at the hospital. Check out is expected at the time of the patient's discharge.

The foundation's mission is to support the RMFH through awareness and fundraising campaigns. An executive director, as well as a Board of Directors, oversee the foundation. Together the foundation, the house manager, and the VA determine how to best serve the house and those who stay there.

Unlike other military non-profits, RMFH Foundation focuses its money on those staying in the house. The donations received help provide all the comforts of a real home including transportation to and from the VA hospital, cable TV, newspaper delivery, snacks and bottled water. The RMFH does not provide meals, but the foundation has set-up a 'meal train' app so that those who wish to volunteer and make a meal for the families staying at the house can easily do so.
