Didi in the Congo

The women of CELCCO in the Province of Congo Central gathered in Matadi in July to learn and strengthen their beliefs. As the country is facing many situations that are creating chaos, suffering and mass murdering, the committee of women decided to talk about jealousy that can lead to death. Various presenters pointed about why are we called as Christians? Christians are the reflection of Jesus Christ. His life was a humble life and not a jealous life and His love endures forever. Since the DRC is having hard time economically, women are exhorted to build a positive mind that may bring peace in the community and to avoid anything that may lead to jealousy that divides community, families, the church and possible the country. It's been 3 months since the rain stopped in the DRC/Congo Central Region; the people are facing difficulty in growing crops and having something to eat. Families are lamenting about famine and are out of stock to feed their families. Churches are incapable to respond to the situation, only praying and asking God's favor for earlier rain may help to overcome the situation. In the meantime, children are suffering from malnutrition and dying. This dilemma is everywhere, and signs of global warming are visible. Please hold the DRC people in your prayers.

Financial Help Pays Big Dividends!

Guess who has helped keep a Madagascar Seminary from closing its doors? **Every one of YOU** who has contributed in the past to the **Mission Endowment Fund**!

The Betela Seminary in Madagascar needed help complying with new requirements: its Dean must obtain a Master's in Divinity to continue operating and training Pastors in Madagascar. The Mission Endowment Fund (MEF) Committee has come alongside Pastor Albert, their Dean, semester after semester providing funds for tuition internet fees and encouragement. With your help, he could continue his work at Betela Seminary while also working towards his degree online. After several years of working full-time while taking classes, he's on the verge of achieving his degree in December 2023! Partnering with Dean Albert enables our brothers and sisters at Beleta Seminary to continue to train future pastors who in turn spread the good news for years to come. Thanks to ALL past MEF donors!

"How is it that **ALL** the past donors helped Dean Albert?" you may wonder. Because the MEF committee distributes a limited portion annually to the mission field, while investing the bulk of the donations for future needs. Through investing the donations, those donations continue to work for years, even decades. The MEF only receives donations specifically designated to the MEF, not a dime from BFLC's budget. The fund receives donations of financial securities (like stocks) or cash from individuals, wills, estates, and trust funds, and is designed to make them last, well, *in perpetuity*.

I know, now you're thinking: "Wow, That's awesome! How can I be part of that?"

The MEF Committee will be searching for new missions to support, and we need new members (early in 2024.) Prayerfully consider how you can best support this effort.
