November 19 - Twenty-Fifth Sunday After Pentecost

First Reading Psalm 90:1-4, 9-10a, 12

1 Lord, you have been our dwelling-place in all generations. ² Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. ³ You turn us back to dust, and say, 'Turn back, you mortals.' ⁴ For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night. ⁹ For all our days pass away under your wrath; our years come to an end like a sigh. ¹⁰ The days of our life are seventy years, or perhaps eighty, if we are strong. ¹² So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart.

Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 5:6-11

Gospel Matthew 25:14-30

25 ¹⁴ "For it will be like a man going on a journey, who called his servants and entrusted to them his property. ¹⁵ To one he gave five bags of gold, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. ¹⁶ He who had received the five bags went at once and traded with them, and he made five bags more. ¹⁷ So also he who had the two bags made two bags more. ¹⁸ But he who had received the one bag went and dug in the ground and hid his master's money. 19 Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. ²⁰ And he who had received the five bags came forward, bringing five bags more, saying, 'Master, you entrusted to me five bags; here, I have made five bags more.' 21 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of your master.' ²² And he also who had the two bags came forward, saving. 'Master, you entrusted to me two bags; here, I have made two bags more.' 23 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant. You have been faithful over a little; I will set you over much. Enter into the joy of vour master.' ²⁴ He also who had received the one bag came forward, saving. 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you scattered no seed, ²⁵ so I was afraid, and I went and hid your bag in the ground. Here, you have what is yours.' ²⁶ But his master answered him, 'You wicked and lazy servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sown and gather where I scattered no seed? ²⁷ Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. ²⁸ So take the bag from him and give it to him who has the ten bags. ²⁹ For to everyone who has will more be given, and he will have an abundance. But from the one who has not, even what he has will be taken away. 30 And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'
