Are you familiar with a paint brush, screwdriver, or hammer? Do you like tinkering on a variety of projects? If so, the BFLC Property Committee wants you! This group maintains the church buildings, equipment, and grounds. There's always something to be done and it's a wonderful group to work with. There are several large projects planned for 2024, including adding electricity, insulation, and new shelving in the pole barn, updating four restrooms, adding a fresh coat of paint to several areas, and installing additional security cameras. In addition to these projects, there are ongoing maintenance activities such as changing furnace filters, adjusting thermostats and timers, cleaning gutters, shampooing carpets, hosting the Spring and Fall Church Workdays, maintaining the lawn and garden equipment and the church van, snow removal, and elevator and fire extinguisher inspections. And there are always the "unplanned" activities too, such as repairing broken faucets or pipes, addressing pump issues, fixing leaking windows or door closure issues, changing light bulbs, and replacing batteries.

If you are interested but don't feel that you have the necessary skills, that's not a problem. Most of us "learn by doing" and there are experts on the committee who can provide guidance on just about any issue encountered. Annual Meeting Minutes February 4, 2024

Black Forest Lutheran Church Council President, Cliff Collier, called the Annual Meeting to order at 12:25 p.m. after determining the 62 confirmed members present met the Constitutional requirement of 61 for a quorum. Pastor Ken opened with devotions from the words of Psalm 46: "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Pastor Ken then led us in prayer.

Kathy Schwindt made a motion to approve the minutes from the Annual Meeting of February 5, 2023 (Annual Report page 2). Del Lang seconded the motion. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

PASTOR'S REPORT (Pastor Ken, Annual Report page 3) Pastor Ken made the reminder that 2023 marked the 10-year anniversary of the Black Forest fire, in which 20 BFLC families lost their homes. In May 2023, we welcomed Andrew Koetsier as our Youth and Family Director, and in August we said goodbye to Michelle Madison and welcomed Stephanie Strasner as church secretary. This year we saw an increase of young families in the congregation, with 17 children consistently coming up for the 10:30 children's sermon and 15-20 for Wiggle Worship each week. Life Groups are going strong, meeting monthly at homes with a Bible Study, discussion and food. This fall we began Life to Life Discipleship, helping people grow in faith and reach out to others. It will be offered again this year. We had 18-25 adults attend a 7-week class "Conflict in the Early Church" based on 1 Corinthians. In August we opened our doors to host both AA and Al-Anon on Tuesday and Thursday evenings. Last year we decided to give a \$50,000 gift to the NALC in thanks to God for the 50-year history of BFLC. In 2023 we gave \$25,000, and are planning to give the remaining \$25,000 this year. The NALC now has 499 congregations in the US and Canada. Pastor Ken is one of 36 Deans of the NALC and serves the Rocky Mountain Mission District. Pastor reported that in 2023, BFLC had 468 baptized members, and with the current new member class, will soon have 489.

<u>FINANCIAL SECRETARY</u> (Annual Report page 14) Nancy Lord reported 2023 Actual Current Contributions were \$541,550. The 2024 Current Income Projections total is \$546,128.

<u>TREASURER'S REPORT</u> was given by John Summerfield. (Annual Report pages 6-13) John reported the Operating Fund Summary for 2023/2024 and the 2023 unallocated funds which were as follows:

2023 Total Income Budget \$526,568 Actual \$546,741 Difference \$20,173 over income
2023 Total Expense Budget \$526,568 Actual \$489,300 Difference (\$37,268) under expenses
2023 Unallocated Funds \$57,441

Lisa Fountain made a motion to accept the recommended distribution of the 2023 Unallocated Funds of \$57,441 with \$25,000 going to NALC for the 2nd BFLC 50-year Gift Installment and \$32,441 going to upcoming church property expenses. Judith Jergensen seconded the motion. No discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

Steve Lord made a motion to approve the 2024 Operating Budget of \$585,769. Del Lang seconded the motion. After discussion concerning the ASI Bond issue, the motion to approve the 2024 Operating Budget was brought to a vote and passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS (a) Nathan Knapp provided explanation and documentation of the process necessary to change the name of the Social Ministry Committee to "Compassionate Outreach" in order to better reflect the committee's purpose of being the "Hands and feet of Jesus". Wolf Thielmann made a motion to change the committee's name. Jon Fountain seconded the motion. Discussion included that the committee's name is listed in the Bylaws, not the Constitution, therefore requires one vote from one annual congregational meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

(b) Service Dates of Council Members were reviewed on page 5 of the Annual Report. (c) Cliff Collier introduced Jessica Worrell and Tiffaney Brooks as the two new candidates for Council. Jim Kent made the motion to accept the new candidates by acclimation. Jon Fountain seconded the motion. Discussion included a question from Mark Hatfield to clarify that the "Council" is separate from "Committees" and that Council Members serve as liaisons to the committees. Motion passed unanimously.

Cliff Collier thanked Connie Schmeisser and Wolf Thielmann for their service on Council, as they are going off.

Staff and Committee liaisons gave short reports highlighting work for 2023. (Annual Report pages 15-30) The property committee confirmed BFLC is in the process of obtaining property insurance.

Jim Kent made a motion to adjourn the Annual Meeting. Del Lang seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Pastor Ken Hohag adjourned the meeting with prayer at 1:52 p.m.
